Andre's Bench is a true story of a gift that was given after The Great East Japan Earthquake and Tsunami of 2011. It is a story of a young girl in Ohio, who never met her grandmother from Ishinomaki, but honored her with a wish to rebuild the park in her grandmother's hometown. It is also the story of a volunteer, Andre, who helped this young girl rebuild Matsunami Park, but passed away suddenly a year after it was built, and a Japanese carpenter in Ishinomaki whose sorrow was channeled to create this bench.

While Andre's bench is an intersection of many lives today dealing with loss, the bench represents a refuge, perhaps in our hearts, that we all need to go to express sorrow, to be heard, and to be understood. The story is a beautiful example of how positive and healing things can come out of something tragic.
